Equestrian Canada's Learn To Ride Program at Centaur

RIDER TESTING: LEVELS 1 - 4

The Equine Canada Learn to Ride program is a national program based on current standards of riding and the Canadian Long -Term Equestrian Development model. This Learn to Ride program includes levels 1 - 4. The purpose of the program is to produce well-rounded horsemen and women, who are able to care for and ride their horses in a correct, safe manner. It is also a stepping stone for anyone wanting to become an Equestrian Instructor or Coach. This program is based on the following manuals that outline the basic horse and stable management knowledge as well as expected riding skills for each level of certification:

- Equestrian Canada English Rider Handbooks (RL1 & 2), (RL 3 to 5), (RL 6 to 8)
- Stable Management in Canada book

Rider Levels are standard across Canada, so once certified a rider can hold their accreditation across the country.

The Learn To Ride preparation is done through

- i. the regular weekly or bi-weekly lesson program, and
- ii. the Stable Management portion is done through a series of Saturday afternoon classes from February to April. Exams will be held in June.
- iii. HFY students only: have the option of being examined for RL1 as part of their class, but do need to sign up to show intent. As well, HFY Students are welcome, and encouraged, to join the Stable management extra preparation classes
